

Alphabet Sorting

What is "Alphabet Sorting" and why is it important?

"Alphabet Sorting" is an activity that helps your child identify letters and learn the sounds associated with them. This is an important step in learning to read.

How can I use "Alphabet Sorting" with my child?

Use an ABC chart which lists the letters of the alphabet in sequence. You can use an upper case chart initially and then substitute a lower case chart to provide practice with both sets of letters. Select words from familiar books, rhymes, chants or your child's environment and write them on a word card. For example, you may write money, monkey, mom, table, tree and toy on cards. Have your child look at the words carefully and place them under the matching letter on the alphabet chart.
